The 2018 Pinot Noir Gap's Crown Vineyard opens with cranberry sauce, baked rhubarb and pomegranate liqueur scents with notes of blood orange, laurel, dried herbs and earth. The medium-bodied palate is soft and nuanced, finely grained and fresh with a long finish. **92**

This is the spiciest wine in the range with interesting hints of sandalwood and jasmine tea on the mix of red and dark fruit aromas. Somewhat surprisingly, the medium- Concentrated as those of the Wildcat Mountain though they are even more intense and beautifully well-detailed while offering excellent length on the firm, serious, youthfully austere and more complex finish. From the Petaluma Gap region of the Sonoma Coast, the 2018 Pinot Noir Gap's Crown Vineyard is similarly purple/ruby-hued and has lots of foresty and pine tree notes as well as beautiful cherry and strawberry fruit, medium to full body, the seamless, pure fruit quality that's the hallmark of the 2018 vintage, and a great finish. It's already hard to resist, and while I don't see a need to delay gratification, it should evolve for 7-8 years. **92 Points** – Jeb Dunnuck, May 2020

Fulcrum 2018 Gap's Crown Vineyard Pinot Noir, Petaluma Gap

We very much like this wine's very evident depth and varietal authority even if it is a bit on the slightly tough and sinewy side relative to the other Pinots from Fulcrum. Its somewhat elevated astringency is preceded by a good degree of fruity extract that makes for easy predictions of better with age, but this one is far and away the one of the bunch that is a wine for later rather than now, and we highly recommend that it be held for at least three or four years with every expectation that it will benefit from several more after that. **90 Points** – June 2020

Clones "828," and 667. 10% whole cluster. Aged 11 months in French oak barrels, 45% new. Moderately dark garnet color in the glass. Oak-kissed black cherry and fertile soil aromas lead to a mid weight plus mouthful of nicely ripened stone and berry fruits accented with a bit of piney oak. Typical Gap's Crown fruit extravagance but less than the 2016 vintage. The oak overlay is a little daunting but the wine would be ideal with a proper food accompaniment such as a grilled steak. **92 Points** - April 2019

2017 Fulcrum Gap's Crown Vineyard Sonoma Coast Pinot Noir

Petaluma Gap. Tipping ever so slightly more to ripeness than its mate from the Wildcat Mountain Vineyard and, if anything, the richer wine of the two, this ample effort is brimming with deep, dark cherry fruit and sports a wealth of creamy, slightly vanillin oak that lends it own brand of sweetness. It is a full and absolutely mouthfilling Pinot that makes up in sheer fruity volume for what it may lack in grace, but it is never bothered by so much as a hint of coarseness or heat, and its very rich flavors go on and on. It is so plump and outgoing that it will make memorable drinking in the immediate term, but its fruity strength will hold it in good stead for at least a half-dozen years. **91 Points** - May 2019

2017 Fulcrum Gap's Crown Vineyard Sonoma Coast Pinot Noir

Coming from the Sonoma Coast, the 2017 Pinot Noir Fulcrum Gap's Crown Vineyard is another solid effort from this estate. Plenty of tart black cherries, black tea, herbs, and a touch of dried soil all give way to a silky, beautifully polished effort that has ripe tannins, nicely integrated acidity. This is a classic, cool climate Pinot Noir that shines for its complexity, as well as elegance. Destemmed and aged 11 months in 45% new French oak, I suspect it will evolve gracefully for upwards of a decade. **91 Points** - Jeb Dunnuck. June 2019

That feral quality, sort of like forest floor mixed with a sage character, a wild and untamed impression, is a quality I seem to get often in Petaluma Gap Pinot Noirs—some from Sangiacomo Vineyard have it. It's a quality that pairs really nicely with earthy foods—mushroom enhanced meals, or duck, maybe cassoulet. But I thought this was **beautifully rendered wine, with Fred Astaire-like masculine grace**, and I was very impressed by how the flavors lingered. Like Astaire, not just style, but grace."
