2013 Fulcrum Landy Vineyard Petite Sirah

"There's not much petite sirah left in the Russian River Valley-pinot noir has all but taken overand yet Sonoma vineyard guru Ulysses Valdez decided to plant some in 2004 on this warm, rocky hillside above the fogline near the border of Dry Creek valley. The dry sunny 2013 vintage ripened the fruit to petite sirah grandeur: muscular without too much weight, dark berry flavors making way for more lifted thyme and violet scents. The tannins have some of petite's trademark mouth-drying gravitas, but this is relatively fine and silky-you'd do well to age it for a decade, but could also decant it now for a steak. It's a wholesome, uniquely California red." 93 Points: Exceptional examples of their type -Luke Sykora, July 2016

"Winemaker David Rossi's first stab at a petite sirah, this comes from a block planted in 2004 in the hills above Westside Road. It's a cool site for petite, expressed in the zingy acidity and stony texture. It remains firm with air, the aromas of juniper and lilac pristine and inviting. This will likely gain complexity with another eight or ten years in the cellar, but you could decant it now for fatty braised lamb shoulder." 92 Points: Exceptional examples of their type -Luke Sykora, August 2015

"It is an opaque, inky black in the glass, with scents of dark flowers, restrained aromas of blackberry and blueberry fruit, pencil shavings, and licorice root. It is full and palate-coating, yet the tannins are refined and velvety.
